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Mark Goldstein was a middle school mathematics teacher in Santa Monica, California for 12 years. He worked at the UCLA Graduate School of Education and Information Studies and the Department of Mathematics from 2001-2010. During that time he taught preservice and inservice courses, wrote curricular materials, and supported teachers in the classroom through professional development and coaching. Mark is a lead author of *Introduction to Algebra* and all programs in the *MathLinks* series. Mark is currently one of CMAT's primary professional development leaders. He received a BS in Mathematics/Applied Economics at UCLA and an MA in Mathematics Education from California State University, Dominguez Hills.



Shelley Kriegler was Director of the UCLA Math Content Programs for Teachers from 1999-2010, where she led efforts to create and implement mathematics authorization programs to increase the mathematics content knowledge for more than 10,000 teachers in California.
